This would be someone who would still be Registered, but would have less expensive fees and would not be able to practice. The California Board of Psychology has this option. I currently use this option over there as I am a former resident and member of their board and do not wish to lose my registration/license with their board. This option allows me to live in Australia and still have the option to return there one day and be an Active member again. I am about to have my third child and will not be employed for at least the next year. It would seem that I would not need PII during this time and will not have time to do CPD. It also feels like a financial burden to pay a full fee for registration when I will not be employed during that time.
