



The data above shows the number of individual practitioners who are Board-approved supervisors in at least one supervision category. Data on the number of supervisors approved for different supervision categories is shown on the following pages.

^a Principal Place of Practice (PPP) is the address declared by the psychologist to be the address at which he or she is predominantly practising the profession. If the psychologist is not practising the profession or is not practising predominantly at one address the Principal Place of Practice may be the psychologist's principal place of residence.

^b As at 4 September 2013 there were 25,492 psychologists with general registration.

^c An overseas Principal Place of Practice means that the address declared by the psychologist to be the address at which he or she is predominantly practising the profession is an address outside of Australia or the psychologist has not declared a Principal Place of Practice and their principal place of residence is not in Australia.

^d The Board first published national data on the number of approved supervisors in March 2012. Transition provisions for supervisors were in place for the first three years of the National Registration and Accreditation Scheme until 30 June 2013 which contributed to a spike in applications for approval as a supervisor just before new requirements for supervisors commenced on 1 July 2013.

^e Registrar programs are undertaken by registered general psychologists in order to qualify for area of practice endorsement. For more information refer to the *Guidelines on area of practice endorsements* which are available from the website at www.psychologyboard.gov.au under the *Standards and Guidelines* tab.

Applies to secondary supervisors only; secondary supervisors do not have to hold endorsement in the same area of practice as the registrar program so they can be approved generally as a registrar program secondary supervisor for any area of practice or for specific areas of practice. Principal supervisors cannot be approved for any area of practice — they must hold the relevant area of practice endorsement.

⁹ Provisional psychologists hold provisional registration which is the registration type under section 62 of the National Law that enables the individual to undertake a period of supervised practice in order to become eligible for general registration. There are three different pathways that can be undertaken by registered provisional psychologists: the 4+2 internship program, the 5+1 internship program, and higher degree programs. Refer to the *Provisional registration* section of the Board's website www.psychologyboard.gov.au for more information on the pathways.

h Since 1 July 2013 all supervisors of psychology higher degree students undertaking placements must be approved by the Board.
