I have briefly reviewed the document and would just provide a brief comment. Firstly, the document is thoughtful and clear. On page 15 there is a typo where "diving" probably refers to "driving". As health policy does not now protect psychological tests from use by non-psychologists we should lobby for changes, if you think this would be helpful. My main concern with this document is that most of the examples of improper test use involve psychologists in the U.S. who are required to have a PhD to practice psychology. I don't think it helps Australian psychologists in protesting that non-psychologists should be restricted in psychological test use if we demonstrate inadequate test use by psychologists.
