I am a counselling psychologist registrar in private practice, and I am gravely concern with PBA's definition of counselling psychologist that is inconsistent with the APS Counselling College . APS Counselling College definition of Counselling Psychologist is as follow:

Counselling psychologists are specialists in the provision of psychological therapy. They provide psychological assessment and psychotherapy for individuals, couples, families and groups, and treat a wide range of psychological problems and mental health disorders

In contrast, the description that the Psychology Board of Australia is:

Counselling psychologists are specialists in the provision of psychological therapy. They provide psychological assessment and psychotherapy for individuals, couples, families and groups, and treat a wide range of psychological problems

I would like to speak for myself and on behalf of my couselling psychologist colleagues in private practice. As a private practioner provding psychological intervention, I receive referrals from General Practioners requesting treatment to their patients diagnosed with mental health disorders. In addition to providing psychotherapy and psychological intervention, I also provide comprehensive psychological assessments of mental health disorders assisting GPs, in making acurate diagnosis, and providing appropriate treatment plans for their patients. I have attached a letter of endorsement from a GP who has consistently referred his patients with mental health disorder to me as evidence of my competency, along with other counselling psychologists' competency in mental health disorders.

I am confident to say that my training in counselling psychology has fully equipped me the skills and expertise in mental health disorder diagnosis and treatment. I would like to see changes to PBA's definition of counselling psychologist which should be consistent with APS Counselling College's definition as stated above. Please add in the words "and mental health disroders" in the last sentence of your definition of Counselling Psychologists.
